The trainees were provided with pivotal opportunity for medical professionals to learn, collaborate, and exchange expertise, ultimately strengthening emergency healthcare systems worldwide.

PROGRESS AND PLANS for 2024

Vision, Passion and Commitment. The collaborative Hubs of Academic Learning Organisations (cHALO) Programme has provided these three ingredients in abundance over the past 2 years as it has evolved from humble beginnings into a truly international collaboration involving colleagues from around the world. It is wonderful to be able to update you on our progress and plans for 2024.

WHAT IS IT? – The original vision began from the leadership Summit led by PSEM in 2019 in Islamabad. Our mission that we launched was to 'fast track' emergency care development in Pakistan in order to meet the urgent needs of a nation. Since then we have run a highly successful virtual conference in 2019 and then finally launched 4 cHALO Centres in Karachi & Hyderabad in October 2023. It was wonderful to work with Dr Azer Sheikh and so many colleagues at SMBBIT and others in Karachi (including Indus Health, AKU & ChildLife) who made it such an excellent event. Our ambition is to have a national network of centres throughout Pakistan that can act as 'hubs' of learning supported by an international faculty from around the world. We know that there are already some centres that are already truly excellent and we look forward to working together for the greater good of all.

WHY IT IS IMPORTANT? - We believe that by enhancing the training of young doctors in Pakistan in the key skills required to care for critically ill and injured patients in Emergency Depts, we can significantly improve outcomes. Led by the PSEM team, and supported by charitable funding to help pump prime the programme, we were able in October 2023 to launch collaborative HALO Centres in Karachi at Indus Hospitals Health Network, the ChildLife Foundation and at the Trauma Centre at SMBBIT as well as form a link with the Civil Hospital, Hyderabad. In 2024 we want to significantly expand the number of physical and virtual cHALO Centres in Pakistan through partnership with colleagues. We are also fortunate to have been able to become part of the South Asian Collaborative for EMergency care (SACEM) which has been endorsed and supported by the International Federation for EM and the Asian Society for EM.

HOW YOU CAN GET INVOLVED? – If you work in a system that wants to collaborate on a range of projects and become a 'virtual' cHALO Centre, then please contact the PSEM Secretariat to seek further information. You may potentially also be able to gain pump priming funds to become a physical cHALO Centre in the future. You can also contact me directly if you wish by email.

NEXT STEPS: On February 8th 2024 we will be launching the next phase of cHALO with the first of a series of monthly webinars. This will be in partnership with SACEM and have IFEM support which is wonderful. More information on that soon. Please join us.

In October 2024 we hope to be launching a number of cHALO Centres in Punjab linked to the next Conference in Lahore. This will be an exciting expansion of the Programme and steadily delivering on the joint vision that we built in 2019!. Thank you again to all those to date for your continuing support – we have achieved much in a short time and yet much more to do!


WORLD FEDERATION FOR MEDICAL EDUCATION

CHILDLIFE WINS 'BEST RESEARCH AWARD' AT INTERNATIONAL EMERGENCY MEDICINE CONFERENCE IN UAE

Emirates Society Emergency Medicine conference has evolved into a premier international platform over the years acknowledging physicians emergency with contributions towards Research in Emergency Medicine. CERTIFICATION PROGRAM IN EMERGENCY MEDICINE (CPEM) CELEBRATES 4TH GRADUATION CEREMONY



CPEM celebrated its 4th Graduation Ceremony on 20th December 2023. Certificate Program in Emergency Medicine is a 12-month competency-based training initiative, crafted to empower physicians working in the Emergency Department with the essential knowledge and clinical expertise required to excel in emergency care. CPEM is an Indus Hospital & Health Network and University of Pennsylvania, USA collaborative effort.

CPEM has now completed 100 EM physicians across Pakistan and Bangladesh and is one of the organized certification programs for capacity building of non-trainee doctors that includes online didactics and simulations as well as 5 hands-on in-person workshops. This makes it reachable to the distant underserved areas of the country. Over the last 4 years, our graduates have not only been able to secure training positions within Pakistan but also abroad, but more importantly, the impact on the quality of care delivered by CPEM graduates in underserved areas has been phenomenal. They have brought a wave of change in their environment and departments, making them champions and leaders for the future.

This ceremony was organized to celebrate the efforts and achievements of our CPEM 23 graduates, local and international faculty, and our past CPEM graduates, who have now turned a full circle and have come back to this program to teach the new batch.

THE INDUS HOSPITAL & HEALTH NETWORK

CONDUCTS 10TH ITERATION OF THE COLLABORATIVE ADVANCED TRAUMA CARE (CAT-C) PROGRAM IN DECEMBER 2023

The Department of Emergency Medicine at the Indus Hospital & Health Network conducted the highly anticipated 10th Iteration of the Collaborative Advanced Trauma Care (CAT-C) program in December 2023. The first course is this series was conducted in September 2019 at Indus Hospital Karachi Campus., Since then it has expanded to 5 different cities across the country as well as internationally to Türkiye, Ethiopia, and Vietnam.

CAT-C is a collaborative venture of the Emergency Department at Indus Hospital and the Global Emergency Medicine section of Emory University and Grady Memorial Hospital, Atlanta, Georgia, USA. The program is endorsed by Pakistan society of Emergency Medicine and aimed at provide inter-professional training and develop trauma teams to reduce morbidity and mortality in trauma-related cases. This Simulation heavy program consists of didactics delivered online as study material and a 3-day hand-on workshop. The course is extremely popular amongst both nurses and doctors, who work as teams and are overlooked by a mix of local and international faculty facilitators.

The course was attended by medical officers and residents from Emergency Medicine, Urology, Orthopedics, General Surgery, and Anesthesia, as well as Emergency Resuscitation Nurses who make a key component of trauma care teams.

The International faculty trainers' team included: Dr. Anna Yaffee, Associate Professor and Director of Global health in the Emergency Medicine Section at the department of Emergency Medicine Emory University, Atlanta, Georgia, USA RN. Emily Russell, Trauma Nurse Specialist at Grady Hospital, Atlanta, Georgia, USA, and Dr. Viquar Qurashi, Orthopedic and Trauma surgeon based in Birmingham, United Kingdom; along with Local Faculty from Indus Emergency Department.

This year, a Training of trainers' course was also introduced to the Karachi cohort. Where 18 selected participants from current and past courses were given the opportunity to be trained as CAT-C trainers. The successful candidates were handed certificates and special CAT-C pins at the closing ceremony.

EDITOR'S CAUSERIE

WHY WE ADVOCATE TIMELY CARE AS OPPOSED TO THE BEST POSSIBLE CARE?

Emergency department sees patients which are unscheduled and come when they have a problem that needs urgent attention. This problem can be either an accident or a medical illness that requires definitive treatment by the particular speciality. The care at the emergency department is different as opposed to OPD or outpatient care, where that particular specialist will see the patient at any scheduled time and prescribe treatment. But in the Emergency Department, that particular specialist may not be available to treat the patient. Now the option is to either let the patient wait for the particular specialist or treatment of that patient by the Emergency Doctor.

The Emergency Department staff is well versed in vast majority of patient conditions and treatment, and they know the ways to treat the patients optimally. The patient then can be followed up by the doctor specialist either as inpatient or as outpatient if the patient is stable enough to be discharged. This brings us to the point that is this dilemma that needs to be worked on. The timely care is worth enough to settle for less than the best care?

Looking at the financial and human logistics, it is neither feasible nor practical to have the specialist available in the emergency departments. As the complaints the patients will seek the remedy of are myriad and all those specialists cannot be made available in the Emergency Departments across city or country. Thus, there are two options, firstly either let the patients wait till the suitable time that particular specialist can come and see the patient, or secondly let the next best resource be made available to bridge this specialty gap. This gap should be



filled by the trained Emergency Doctor. This doctor should be proficient is dealing with unscheduled and undifferentiated patients of all ages. This approach is safe and also cost effective and doable.
